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Pattern: Pullover - Franklin

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## Pullover-Franklin (Fig. A, Back Cover)

MATERIALS:

PATONS TOTEM Knitting Wool.

Quantity . . . . . . . . . . . 1 lb. 2 ozs. Beehive Knitting Needles-1 pair each Nos. 4 and 7.

MEASUREMENTS:-

Length from top of shoulder—
26½ ins. (shorter if desired). Width all round at under arm .. 39 ins. Length of sleeve from under arm 20 ins.

ABBREVIATIONS:-See page 2.

TENSION:-To get these measurements it is absolutely necessary to work at a tension to roduce 4½ stitches to the inch in width. Check tension—see page 2.

THE FRONT. — \*\* Using the No. 7 Needles, cast on 80 stitches.

1st row.—K.2, \* P.1, K.1, repeat from \* to

the end of the row.

Repeat the 1st row nineteen times.
Using No. 4 Needles, proceed as follows:—

1st row.—Knit plain.
2nd row.—K.1, purl to the last stitch, K.1.
Continue working in plain, smooth fabric until the work measures 17 inches from the commencement, \*\*

In the next row, K.35, cast off 10 stitches,

Continue working on the last 35 stitches as follows:

Work 8 rows in plain, smooth fabric.

9th row.—Cast off 6 stitches, purl to the

last stitch, K.1.
Continue working in plain, smooth fabric, decreasing once at the beginning of the needle in the next and every following 6th row, until 22 stitches remain.

Continue without shaping until the work measures 26 inches (shorter if desired) from the commencement, ending with a purl row. Shape for the shoulder as follows:—

1st row.—Work to the last 7 stitches, turn.

2nd row.—Work to the end of the row.
3rd row.—Work to the last 14 stitches, turn.
4th row.—Work to the end of the row. Cast

Join in the wool at the neck edge and work the other side to correspond.

THE BACK .- Work from \*\* to \*\* as given for the Front.

Work 8 rows in plain, smooth fabric. Cast off 6 stitches at the beginning of the needle in each of the next 2 rows, then continue working in plain, smooth fabric without shaping, until the arm-hole measures the same as the Front arm-hole

Shape for the shoulders as follows:—

1st and 2nd rows.—Work to the last 7

3rd and 4th rows.-Work to the last 14 stitches, turn. 5th and 6th rows.-Work to the last 22

stitches, turn.

7th row.-Work to the end of the row.

THE SLEEVES .- Using the No. 7 Needles,

cast on 54 stitches.

1st row.—K.2, \* P.1, K.1, repeat from \* to

the end of the row.
Repeat the 1st row twenty five times.

Using No. 4 Needles, proceed as follows:—
1st row.—K.1, \* increase once in the next stitch, K.2, increase once in the next stitch, K.3, repeat from \* to the last 4 stitches, increase once in the next stitch, K.2, increase once in the last stitch (70 stitches)

2nd row.—K.1, purl to the last stitch, K.1. 3rd row.—Knit plain.

Continue working in plain, smooth fabric without shaping until the work measures 21 inches from the commencement. Cast off. Work another Sleeve in the same manner.

THE NECK-BAND.—Using the No. 7 Needles, cast on 24 stitches.

1st row.—Knit plain.
2nd row.—K.1, purl to the last stitch, K.1.

Repeat the 1st and 2nd rows until the work measures 24 inches, or length required, from the commencement. Cast off.

TO MAKE UP THE PULL-OVER.-With a slightly damp cloth and warm iron, press seams. Sew up the side, shoulder and seem to seems. Sew in the sleeves, placing seam to seam. Fold the neck-band in half with the right side out, and sew into position round the neck, placing the left hand side over the right hand side to form a "V."



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
